2019 DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

Case #2019-022C & 2019-023C

Respondent: Buford Security Agency

Date: November 7, 2019

Disposition: Respondent violated Ala. Code §§ 34-27C-4(a) and 34-27C-7(a) (1975 as amended) for operating as a contract security company without being properly licensed as well as failing to register and license its employees. Respondent entered into a consent agreement with the Board regarding the alleged violations. Pursuant to the consent agreement, Respondent was assessed a fine of \$500.00.

Case #2019-012BR

Respondent: PESG of Alabama, LLC

Date: August 8, 2019

Disposition: Respondent violated Ala. Code §§ 34-27C-4(a) and 34-27C-7(a) (1975 as amended) for operating as a contract security company without being properly licensed as well as failing to register and license its employees. Respondent entered into a consent agreement with the Board regarding the alleged violations. Pursuant to the consent agreement, Respondent was assessed a fine of \$3,500.00.

Case #2019-006BR

Respondent: Guardian Security Management

Date: August 8, 2019

Disposition: Respondent violated Ala. Code §§ 34-27C-4(a) and 34-27C-7(a) (1975 as amended) for operating as a contract security company without being properly licensed as well as failing to register and license its employees. Respondent entered into a consent agreement with the Board regarding the alleged violations. Pursuant to the consent agreement, Respondent was assessed a fine of \$500.00 and placed on probation for one (1) year.

Case #2019-019C

Respondent: Security Associates of Alabama

Date: August 8, 2019

Disposition: Respondent violated Ala. Code §§ 34-27C-4(a) and 34-27C-7(a) (1975 as amended) by failing to register and license its employees. Respondent entered into a consent agreement with the Board regarding the alleged violations. Pursuant to the consent agreement, Respondent was assessed a fine of \$2,500.00 and placed on probation for one (1) year.

Respondent: Shield Protection Service

Date: July 17, 2019

Disposition: Respondent violated Ala. Code § 34-27C-4 (1975 as amended) for operating and advertising as a contract security company without being properly licensed. A Cease and Desist Letter was issued to Respondent regarding the alleged violation.

Disposition: Respondent violated Ala. Code § 34-27C-4 (1975 as amended) for operating and advertising as a contract security company without being properly licensed. A Cease and Desist Letter was issued to Respondent regarding the alleged violation.

Date: July 17, 2019

Disposition: Respondent violated Ala. Code § 34-27C-4 (1975 as amended) for operating and advertising as a contract security company without being properly licensed. A Cease and Desist Letter was issued to Respondent regarding the alleged violation.

Case #2019-011BR

Respondent: B & A Security, LLC

Date: May 9, 2019

Disposition: Respondent violated Ala. Code §§ 34-27C-4(a) and 34-27C-7(a) (1975 as amended) for operating as a contract security company without being properly licensed as well as failing to register and license its employees. Respondent entered into a consent agreement with the Board regarding the alleged violations. Pursuant to the consent agreement, Respondent was assessed a fine of \$2,000.00.

Case #2018-016C

Respondent: C and C Services

Date: February 7, 2019

Disposition: Respondent violated Ala. Code §§ 34-27C-4(a) and 34-27C-7(a) (1975 as amended) for failure to register and license its employees. Respondent entered into a consent agreement with the Board regarding the alleged violations. Pursuant to the consent agreement, Respondent was assessed a fine of \$2,500.00.

Case #2018-018BR

Respondent: Riley Security

Date: February 7, 2019

Disposition: Respondent violated Ala. Code §§ 34-27C-4(a) and 34-27C-7(a) (1975 as amended) for operating as a contract security company without being properly licensed as well as failing to

register and license its employees. Respondent entered into a consent agreement with the Board regarding the alleged violations. Pursuant to the consent agreement, Respondent was assessed a fine of \$2,000.00.

Case #2019-003C

Respondent: Southern Jamm, Inc.

Date: February 7, 2019

Disposition: Respondent violated Ala. Code §§ 34-27C-3(a)(14) and 34-27C-4(a) (1975 as amended) for operating as a contract security company without being properly licensed as well as refusing to cooperate with an inspection of the business premises. Respondent entered into a consent agreement with the Board regarding the alleged violations. Pursuant to the consent agreement, Respondent was assessed a fine of \$2,000.00.

Case #2018-010C

Respondent: Anthony L Winston

Date: February 7, 2019

Disposition: Respondent violated Ala. Code § 34-27C-11 (1975 as amended) for carrying a firearm in the performance of his duties without holding a valid certification card for an armed security officer issued by the Board. An administrative hearing was held on February 7, 2019 and the Board entered a Final Order revoking Respondent's unarmed security guard license.
